So are fluids for vehicles.

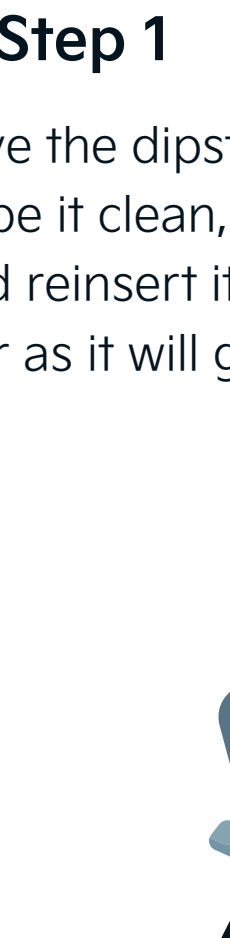


Engine oil = Blood

As our blood circulates around the body, it helps keep us alive.

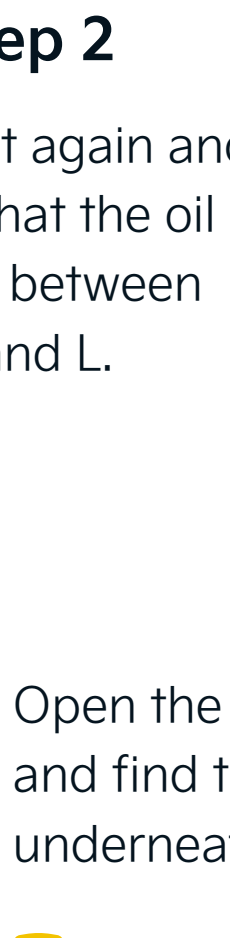
Engine oil reduces friction and lowers temperatures in the cylinders.

How to check engine oil level



Step 1

Remove the dipstick, wipe it clean, and reinsert it as far as it will go.



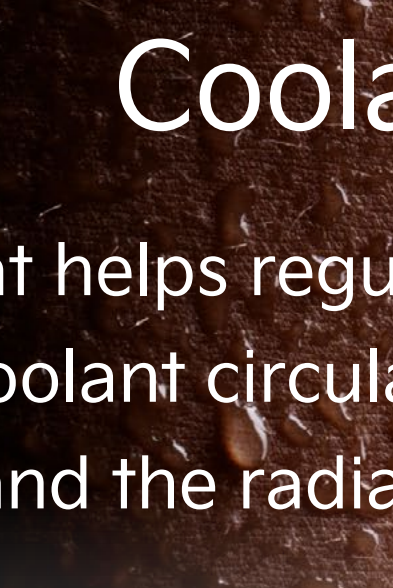
Step 2

Remove it again and check that the oil level is between F and L.



Step 3

If it is lower than L, top up the oil.



Open the bonnet and find the dipstick underneath the engine.

Coolant = Sweat

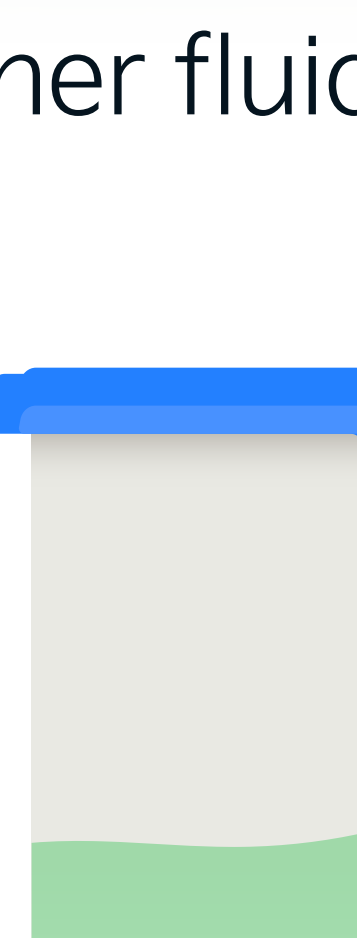
Sweat helps regulate our body temperature. Coolant circulates between the engine and the radiator, cooling the engine.

How to check coolant



Step 1

Check the MAX (F) / MIN (L) lines on the coolant reservoir.

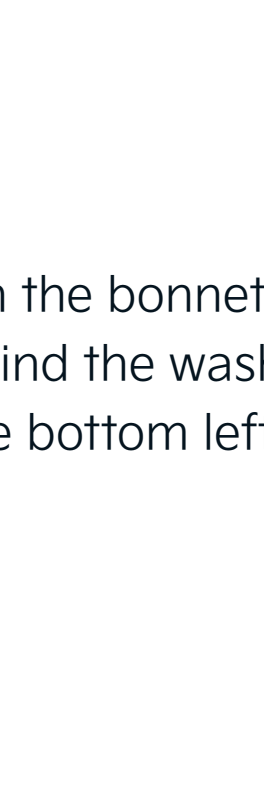


Step 2

Check that the engine is cold.

Step 3

Fill with a 1:1 ratio of distilled water and anti-freeze and top up the tank to a level between the MAX (F) / MIN (L) lines.



Distilled water

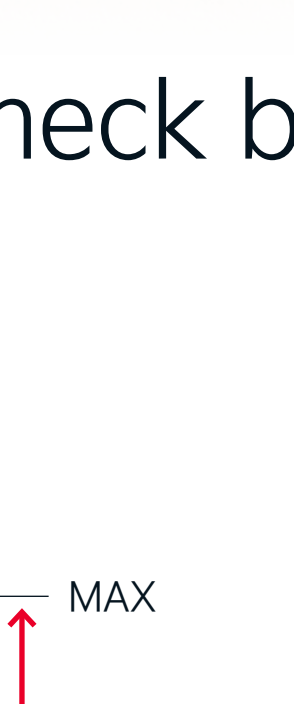
Anti-freeze



Open the bonnet and find the coolant reservoir at the top left.

Washer fluid = Tears

Tears protect our eyes, as well as wash dust away. Washer fluid keeps the windscreen clean.

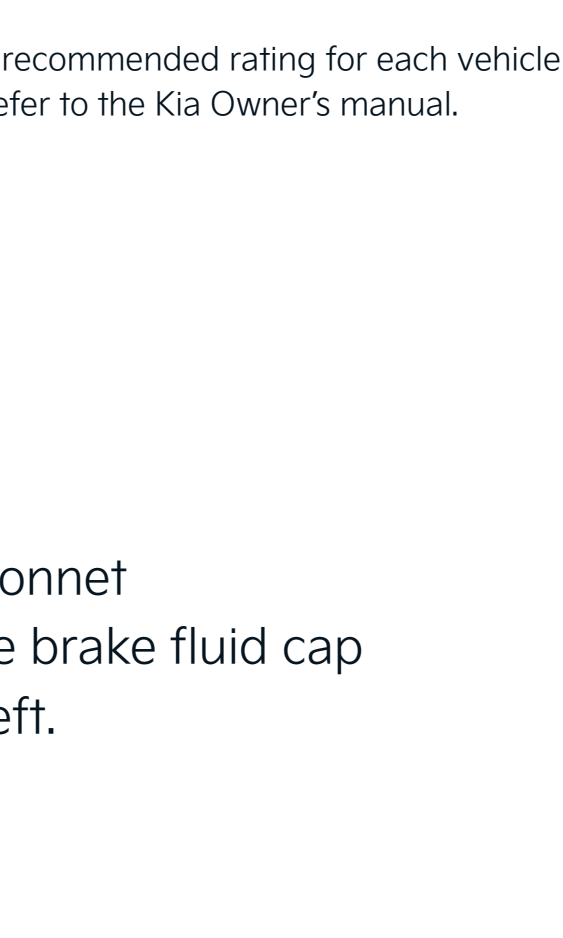


How to check washer fluid



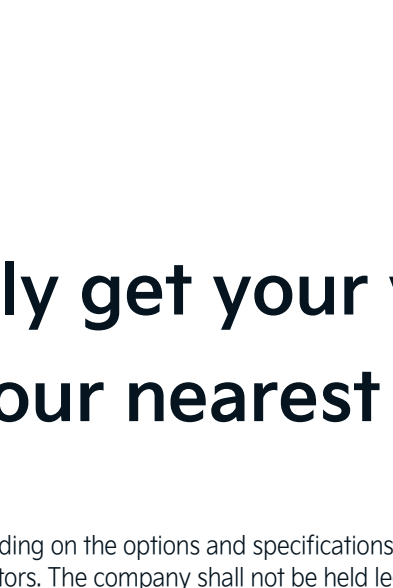
Step 1

Check the level of the windscreen washer fluid reservoir.



Step 2

If it is low, top up to the MAX line.



Open the bonnet and find the washer fluid cap at the bottom left.
